Design a Flag for a New City Imagine a brand-new city is being built because the population is growing. Design a flag and give the city a name!	A Day in a Busy City vs. A Quiet Village Write a story or diary entry comparing life in a crowded city and a small village. What's different? What do you see, hear, and do?	Build a Town Map Draw or build a model of a town with a small population, then add more houses, schools, and roads to show how it might grow.
Create Your Own Planet Draw or paint a brand-new planet. Give it a name, describe its weather, creatures, and landscape.	Rocket Design Challenge Design and decorate your own rocket using recycled materials (toilet rolls, boxes, foil, etc.).	Moon Diary: Observe the moon for a week and draw and write what it looks like each night.
My Life as an Astronaut Write a short story about a day in space. What do you eat? How do you sleep? What do you see out the window?	Use a dictionary to find out the meanings of the words below which link to our Science. Write them into your homework book. galaxy, resistance, spherical, hemisphere	What do you want to achieve this year, both in and out of school. Discuss this with an adult at home and write out/draw a plan of how you can achieve your goals.
Write a letter to a friend about the importance of reading at home. Try to include at least four reasons.	Free choice! Create a piece of work which shows all you remember from last year. This can be presented however you like.	Play a board game as a family. Talk about how it feels to be a winner or a loser. Take a photo and send it in to the school office/stick it in your homework book.
