English: Choose 3 Ancient Egyptian gods or goddesses (e.g., Ra, Isis, Anubis). Create a fact file foreach including: ○ Their name and role ○ What they looked like ○ Symbols they are associated with ○ Why they were important	DT: Make Ancient Egyptian Flatbread (Aish Baladi). Take photos and stick them into your homework book.	Maths: learn your 3, 4, 6, 7 times tables off by heart. Answer quiz questions with an adult in school to prove you have mastered these. This may take you a few tries as we will be looking for perfection! You will only receive the points once you are confident with these so this should be completed alongside another task.
English: Create a comic strip showing the journey of an Ancient Egyptian person to the afterlife. Include: ○ Mummification ○ The weighing of the heart ceremony ○ Meeting Osiris in the afterlife.	Maths: Ask your teacher for a booklet of the Maths you covered last half term. Complete the whole booklet to receive the points.	Writing: Write a short story or myth involving two Egyptian gods. It could explain something in nature (like why the sun rises) or teach a lesson.
Art: Design and colour an Ancient Egyptian amulet believed to bring protection or luck in the afterlife. Try and use a range of different materials to create this.	Art/DT: Choose one Egyptian god and design a mask based on their appearance. Use paper plates, cardboard, or printable templates.	Handwriting: Ask for a handwriting booklet from Mrs. Phelan © Complete the whole booklet to gain the points.
Writing: Write your name using Ancient Egyptian hieroglyphs and decorate it like a cartouche (royal nameplate).	Free choice! Create a piece of work which shows all you remember from last half term. This can be presented however you like.	Oracy: with an adult, discuss what 'trust' means to you and the importance of it. Write bullet points of your discussion in your homework book.

Remember, your homework should be presented to the highest standard and classroom expectations apply. You may be asked to repeat homework that is poorly completed. This is to ensure you push yourself to be the best you can be!
