The Peri-ometer suggests the difficulty or challenge the homework may offer. Each week you must choose your task from the menu ensuring that at least one 'EXTRA HOT' task is completed over the half term!

These homework tasks are in addition to spellings, Times Table Rockstars, and home reading tasks.



Design a Research Station

Task: Draw or build (with LEGO or craft materials) your own Antarctic research station. Think about where scientists sleep, eat, and work.
Challenge: Include features that help people stay warm and safe in freezing temperatures.

Invent an Antarctic Outfit

Task: Design a special outfit for someone living in Antarctica. Label the materials and explain why each part is important.
Challenge: Think about insulation, waterproofing, and visibility in snowstorms.

Antarctic Poster

Task: Create a poster all about Antarctica including a map of its location, information about its climate and physical features.
Challenge: Add information about some of the species that are found there.

Antarctic Animal Adaptations Poster

Task: Make a poster showing how animals survive in Antarctica (e.g., penguins, seals, whales).
Challenge: Explain how each adaptation helps the animal live in the cold.

RE

In RE we are going to be looking at different versions of the bible. Can you write a comic book style version of one of the bible stories.

Sketch a chassis

In DT we are going to be creating our own slingshot cars. As part of this we are going to be designing a chassis that reduces air resistance. Can you sketch a car chassis that has a low amount of air resistance?

Trust

Think of a way of representing this half term's Christian value of trust.

Draw your own food web

Can you create a food web from producer to predator? Is your food web going to be for the Amazon or Antarctica?

French Colours

Can you find out the names of the colours in French? Write them in your homework book with the correct colour in English.

Know all your multiplication and division facts for the above tables. Either collect a times table sheet and complete or record the tables in your homework book
