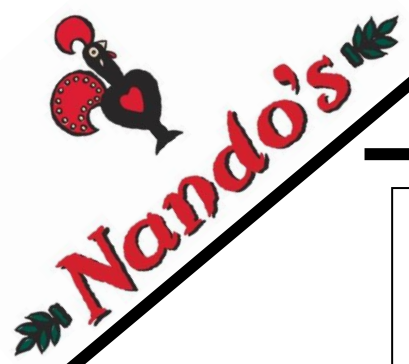




Reception/Year 1 homework

Castle craft: Make a model of a castle using junk modelling materials. Think about how you will join the different materials together. Can you name any of the castle features?	Design a crown Create and decorate your own royal crown. Develop your cutting and sticking.	Numberland: Create your own number land at home. Which numbers will you include on your street? What objects can you find to represent these numbers? For example, you might add a cat to number 4 because it has 4 legs.
Royal speech: If you were the king or queen, what would the rules of your kingdom be? Tell a grown up and ask them to write down your ideas. Make sure to use full sentences.	Traditional tale: We will be reading Jack and the Beanstalk. Can you read a different traditional tale and learn to retell it?	Bible stories: Learn about a story from the Bible and create a picture to show your favourite part?
Medieval music: Listen to a piece of medieval music. Did you like this piece of music? What instruments could you hear? How did it make you feel?	Make a hope star: What hopes do you have for the new year ahead? Make a hope star to display your ideas.	Winter walk: Go for a Winter walk and look for at least 5 signs of winter. Take pictures, draw or write a list showing what you found.
